Overview the U.S. GSP Program



U.S. Tariff Schedule

- 11,100 products in U.S. Tariff Schedule
- 4,200 “MFN-free” products
 - most metal ores, and furniture, to sunflower seeds
- 1,900 products subjected to permanent tariffs
- 3,500 products eligible for all GSP beneficiary countries



GSP Program - Overview

- Assist developing countries diversify export markets
- 119 beneficiary countries and territories
- \$21.5 billion in total exports claimed in 2022
- Duty-free benefits under GSP lapsed as of January 1, 2021



GSP Expiration

- Congress responsible for reauthorizing GSP
- Continue to Claim GSP
 - Importers should continue to mark GSP-eligible importations with the special program indicator for GSP “A”

GSP Program – Product Eligibility

Eligible

- Many manufactured items & minerals
- Some travel goods (e.g. leather bags, purses) Jewelry
- Some agricultural goods (e.g. cherry jam, certain wines, dates)

Ineligible

- Most textiles, apparel, & footwear
- Sensitive steel products
- Watches
- Some leather goods
- Some agricultural products (e.g. meats)





GSP Program – GSP Product Review

- Petitions by interested parties for products to be added to or removed from GSP (products are added for all GSP beneficiaries)
- 2020 review – over 90 products petitioned
- Petitions accepted for review (and granted)
 - Addition of fresh cut roses for all GSP members
 - Removal of parboiled rice for all GSP members
- Study by the International Trade Commission on economic impact.
- Public hearing



GSP Program – GSP Product Review

- In evaluating product petitions the GSP Subcommittee looks at various factors, including:
 - the impact that the addition would have on furthering economic development of beneficiaries;
 - whether other major developed countries are undertaking a comparable effort to grant trade preferences for such products;
 - the anticipated impact of such action on U.S. producers or like or directly competitive products; and
 - the extent of the beneficiary developing country's competitiveness with respect to such products.



GSP Program – Country Eligibility

- Income under \$13,205 per capita
 - World Bank high-income threshold
- 15 Eligibility Criteria
 - Reasonable market access for U.S. exports
 - Protecting worker rights & combatting the worst forms of child labor
 - Protecting U.S. intellectual property rights (IPR)
 - Compensation for expropriation/arbitral awards

GSP Program – Country Practice Review and Assessment

Review of compliance with GSP eligibility criteria

- Annual Petition Process
 - Filed by interested parties as part of GSP annual review
- U.S. Government initiated Assessment Process
 - 3-year cycle, on a regional basis USTR and the GSP Subcommittee
- Current reviews
 - Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan, Zimbabwe, and Eritrea (worker rights), Indonesia and South Africa (Intellectual Property Rights), Ecuador (Arbitral awards)

Armenia's GSP Exports



Armenia's 2022 GSP Exports to the U.S.

- Exports under GSP accounted for 42.3% of total exports to United States
 - Total exports to the U.S. under GSP \$34.3 million
 - Total exports to the U.S. \$81.1 million



Armenia GSP Exports

| HTS Description | 2019 | 2020 | 2021 | 2022 |
|--|---------------|---------------|---------------|---------------|
| Precious metal articles of jewelry (other than silver) | \$2.8 million | \$9.1 million | \$26 million | \$23 million |
| Gold Necklaces and Gold chains | \$190k | \$536k | \$7.8 million | \$5.1 million |
| Mineral waters | \$416k | \$591k | \$980k | \$1.4 million |
| Vegetables (including olives) prepared by vinegar or acetic acid | \$583k | \$638k | \$958k | \$749k |



Examples of Duty Savings on Armenian Exports 2022

| HTS Description | MFN Rate | Imports for U.S. Consumption | Share of Eligible Imports using GSP | Tariff savings |
|------------------------------------|----------|------------------------------|-------------------------------------|----------------|
| Precious metal articles of jewelry | 5% | \$23 million | 99% | \$1,149,654 |
| Gold Necklaces and Gold chains | 5% | \$5.1 million | 99.4% | \$257,270 |
| Mineral waters | .39% | \$1.4 million | 60% | \$5,336 |



Underutilization of GSP

| HTS Description | MFN Rate | Imports for U.S. Consumption | Share of Eligible Imports using GSP | Tariff savings | Potential Additional Savings |
|---|----------|------------------------------|-------------------------------------|----------------|------------------------------|
| Vegetables (including olives) prepared other than by vinegar or acetic acid | 11% | \$605,560 | 46% | \$30.5k | \$36.1k |
| Silver articles of jewelry | 5% | \$445.2k | 0% | 0 | \$22,258k |
| Precious metal articles of jewelry (other than silver) | 5% | \$23 million | 99% | \$1,149,654 | \$12,343 |

How to Utilize the GSP Program



How to Qualify for Duty-Free GSP Treatment

- GSP-eligible product
 - ✓ Is it on the list of GSP-eligible products?
 - ✓ Does it meet the rules of origin?
 - Is it produced or grown in a GSP country?
 - If the product is using some 3rd country inputs, is the local content $\geq 35\%$ of the value of the product? Or have the 3rd country inputs undergone substantial transformation?
 - Has it entered the commerce of another country?
- Benefit claimed by U.S. importer on Customs Form 7501 (Line 27 – “A”)
- Keep records to verify GSP claim



Expand Armenia's GSP Benefits

- Claim GSP on 100% of all eligible products
- Consider GSP eligible products exported to other markets
- Connect with importers of similar products excluded for other countries



Expand Armenia's GSP benefits

- In recent years, a number of countries have been removed from GSP or had their benefits reduced
 - Importers of these products now pay the MFN duty rate
 - Turkey and India lost GSP for all of their products in 2019
 - General Notes 4(d) of the HTSUS lists all products excluded for specific countries
- Identify if Armenia produces and/or exports these products
- Use GSP as a marketing tool



Understanding the U.S. Market

- Role of Importers
- Responsible for ensuring all regulations are met
- Private sector standards often require stringent sustainable practices/labor standards
- U.S. Customs Brokers best source for sector specific information
