Overall Objective: The project is aiming to establish the Cross-Border physical

and virtual Tourism Trail (3000 km) "Black Sea Silk Road

Corridor" (BSSRC) in and between Partner states.

- 402 information panels, 73 signboards, 210 road signs and 94 hiking marks (Physical Route) have been installed in 258 attractions in 4 countries.
- A webpage (http://blackseasilkroad.com/) was created, which includes information on historical, cultural and natural monuments as well as other attractions (Virtual Route).
